A New Investment in Prevention



Micah's Hugs has received a \$95,000 State Opioid Response (SOR IV) award supporting substance use and fentanyl prevention education from September 2026 through August 2027. The work will help expand school and community education across Sonoma, Marin and Napa counties, strengthen referral partnerships, increase bilingual outreach and continue connecting communities with naloxone and fentanyl test strips.

EDUCATION & YOUTH

Youth Voice: What's Next

We are developing deeper youth leadership opportunities that move beyond one-time prevention presentations. Our vision is to help young people research issues that matter to them, strengthen public speaking and advocacy skills, become credible messengers, and create youth-led prevention media - including podcasts, video, interviews, public-service messages and storytelling projects.

Schools & Community Education

Micah's Hugs continues to bring real-life, trauma-informed substance use and fentanyl prevention education into schools, colleges and community settings. Presentations address fentanyl and counterfeit pills, overdose recognition and response, naloxone, stigma reduction and help-seeking. In 2025, Micah's Hugs delivered 68 drug education and fentanyl awareness presentations throughout Sonoma County and parts of Northern California.

SAVE A LIFE STATIONS Micah's Hugs continues to expand low-barrier access to naloxone through community Save a Life Stations. Advocacy & What's Next

Micah's Hugs is Going to Whashington DC

We are preparing to take our prevention and advocacy work to Washington, D.C. The goal is to bring lived experience, the voices of families and young people, and lessons from our community work into conversations with national leaders. We want policymakers to understand what communities are facing, what practical prevention looks like on the ground, and why youth education, naloxone access, recovery support and family voices matter.

Youth Voice, Media & Civic Engagement

As our youth programming grows, we want young people to have opportunities not only to learn about substance use prevention, but also to research issues, tell stories, create media, speak publicly and participate in civic engagement. Partnerships with organizations that bring media, technical, educational and youth-development expertise can help turn that vision into meaningful hands-on experiences.

Threads 2026

In November, Micah's Hugs will participate in Sonoma County DHS's THREADS conference in the session "From Awareness to Action: A Community Partnership with Daniel Lionett." The session will focus on practical, low-cost overdose prevention, partnerships, naloxone access, education and lived experience.
